
















The Little Red Book Wagon is here!



Paying the Bills:

Potential Sources of Retirement Income



Planning your retirement income is like putting together a puzzle with many different pieces. One of the first steps you can expect each one to provide.

in the process is to identify all potential income sources and estimate how much



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SOCIAL SECURITY

According to the Social Security Administration (SSA), more than 8 of 10 people aged 65 or older receive Social Security benefits. However, most retirees also rely on other sources of income. For a rough estimate of the annual benefit to which you would be entitled at various retirement ages, you can use the calculator on the Social Security website, www.ssa.gov. Your Social Security retirement benefit is calculated using a formula that takes into account your 35 highest earnings years. How much you receive ultimately depends on a number of factors, including when you start taking benefits. You can begin doing so as early as age 62. However, your benefit may be approximately 25% to 30% less than if you waited until full retirement age (66 to 67, depending on the year you were born). Benefits increase each year that you delay taking benefits until you reach age 70. As you're planning, remember that the question of how Social Security will meet its long-term obligations to both baby boomers and later generations has become a hot topic of discussion. Concerns about the system's solvency indicate that there's likely to be a change in how those benefits are funded, administered, and/or taxed over the next 20 or 30 years. That may introduce additional uncertainty about Social Security's role as part of your overall long-term retirement income picture, and put additional emphasis on other potential income sources.

PENSIONS

If you are entitled to receive a traditional pension, you're lucky; fewer Americans are covered by them every year. Be aware that even if you expect pension payments, many companies are changing their plan provisions. Ask your employer if your pension will increase with inflation, and if so, how that increase is calculated. Your pension will most likely be offered as either a single or a joint and survivor annuity. A single annuity provides benefits until the worker's death; a joint and survivor annuity provides reduced benefits that last until the survivor's death. The law requires married couples to take a joint and survivor annuity unless the spouse signs away those rights. Consider rejecting it only if the surviving spouse will have income that equals at least 75% of the current joint income. Be sure to fully plan your retirement budget before you make this decision.

WORK OR OTHER INCOME-PRODUCING ACTIVITIES

Many retirees plan to work for at least a while in their retirement years at part-time work, a fulfilling second career, or consulting or freelance assignments. Obviously, while you're continuing to earn, you'll rely less on your savings, leaving more to accumulate for the future. Work also may provide access to affordable health care. Be aware that if you're receiving Social Security benefits before you reach your full retirement age, earned income may affect the amount of your benefit payments until you do reach full retirement age. If you're covered by a pension plan, you may be able to retire, then seek work elsewhere. This way, you might be able to receive both your new salary and your pension benefit from your previous employer at the same time. Also, some employers have begun to offer phased retirement programs, which allow you to receive all or part of your pension benefit once you've reached retirement age, while you continue to work part-time for the same employer. Other possible resources include rental property income and royalties from existing assets, such as intellectual property.

RETIREMENT SAVINGS/INVESTMENTS

While working, you hopefully have saved through retirement accounts such as IRAs, 401(k)s, or other tax-advantaged plans, as well as in taxable accounts. Your challenge now is to convert your savings into ongoing income. There are many ways to do that, including periodic withdrawals, choosing an annuity if available, increasing your allocation to income-generating investments, or using some combination. Make sure you understand the tax consequences before you act.

Some of the factors you'll need to consider when planning how to tap your retirement savings include:

- · How much you can afford to withdraw each year without exhausting your nest egg. You'll need to take into account not only your projected expenses and other income sources, but also your asset allocation, your life expectancy, and whether you expect to use both principal and income, or income alone.
- · The order in which you will tap various accounts. Tax considerations can affect which account you should use first, and which you should defer using.
- How you'll deal with required minimum distributions (RMDs) from certain tax-advantaged accounts. After age 70½, if you withdraw less than your RMD, you'll pay a penalty tax equal to 50% of the amount you failed to withdraw.

Some investments, such as certain types of annuities, are designed to provide a guaranteed monthly income (subject to the claims-paying ability of the issuer). Others may pay an amount that varies periodically, depending on how your investments perform. You also can choose to balance your investment choices to provide some of both types of income.

INHERITANCE

An inheritance, whether anticipated or in hand, brings special challenges. If a potential inheritance has an impact on your anticipated retirement income, you might be able to help your parents investigate estate planning tools that can minimize the impact of taxes on their estate. Your retirement income also may be affected by whether you hope to leave an inheritance for your loved ones. If you do, you may benefit from specialized financial planning advice that can integrate your income needs with a future bequest.

EQUITY IN YOUR HOME OR BUSINESS

If you have built up substantial home equity, you may be able to tap it as a source of retirement income. Selling your home, then downsizing or buying in a lower-cost region, and investing that freed-up cash to produce income or to be used as needed is one possibility. Another is a reverse mortgage, which allows you to continue to live in your home while borrowing against its value. That loan and any accumulated interest is eventually repaid by the last surviving borrower when he or she eventually sells the home, permanently vacates the property, or dies. (However, you need to carefully consider the risks and costs before borrowing. A useful publication titled "Reverse Mortgages: Avoiding a Reversal of Fortune" is available online from the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority.)


If you're hoping to convert an existing business into retirement income, you may benefit from careful financial planning to minimize the tax impact of a sale. Also, if you have partners, you'll likely need to make sure you have a buy-sell agreement that specifies what will happen to the business when you retire and how you'll be compensated for your interest. With an expert to help you identify and analyze all your potential sources of retirement income, you may discover you have more options than you realize.

The next time you see a little white cotton fluff ball sitting still out in front of 201 Broad St make sure you stop and say hello!









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The Barta Billfish Tournament

Every June we have a fantastic event on the Beaufort Water Front and the waters off our shore. It is the Barta fishing tournament, and this year it is celebrating its 13th annual tournament.

This is one of the most unique and philanthropic tournaments around. To date the tournament has raised over \$875,000 for the Boys & Girls Clubs of Coastal Carolina. This money is used to support the three clubs in Beaufort, Morehead City and Havelock. The Boys and Girls Clubs of Coastal Carolina puts 86% of the money raised directly back into the programs to support the children and the other 14% is spent on operating funds.

What makes it unique is that is that the anglers are all kids! On average the tournament floats 50 boats participating in the event and 98% of all the billfish released are by kids 16 years or younger. Often times this is their first billfish they have ever reeled in. The Tournament is the only tournament in NC that is 100% Billfish Release. Their goal is to teach children to enjoy the sport of fishing while learning that we have to conserve nature in the ocean and not kill a fish for personal gain.

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The tournament kicks off Thursday July 14th when the Captain Stacy fishing boat docks in Beaufort and 45 Boys & Girls Club Members get to take a fishing trip before the official tournament kick off at 6pm that evening. It was important for the tournament to provide a fishing trip for Boys & Girls Club kids so they do not feel left out of the festivities.

The cost of the tournament is very "family friendly." For inshore tournament it is \$350 and for the billfish tournament it is \$800. Entries include dinner tickets for three wonderful meals by Outback, Murphy Brown, and Fat Fellas, beverages and for the billfish entry there is also a \$500 general donation that goes directly to the Boys & Girls Club.

There is a huge silent auction on Friday "Release Marine Family Night" that brings in a great deal of money for the Boys & Girls

Club. The night is open to the public and the auction tables have something for everyone and in all price ranges.

The event takes hundreds of volunteers to make it a success from set-up, selling tee shirts, working the auction, weigh-in, serving food, clean up to packing everything up when it is over. The tournament started in 2004 when outdoor fishing and hunting legend and TV outdoors show host Tred Barta made a commitment to raise \$1,000,000 for the Boys & Girls Clubs of the Crystal Coast. Not even a rare spinal stroke and paralysis from the chest down could prevent Captain Barta from fulfilling his promise. He attends the tournament each year and is a powerful presence, truly showing his commitment to the kids.

• 1 (3-ounce) package of cream cheese, room temperature


- · 1 cup grated sharp cheddar



A Look Inside

THE MATTIE KING DAVIS **ART GALLERY**

The Mattie King Art Gallery is a setback hidden gem in downtown Beaufort, setting just behind and to the left of the Beaufort Historic Site building located on Turner Street. Some of you probably have stopped in it before and slowly strolled through the small rooms in wonderment of the art that lines the walls of each room. Others maybe still have it on your bucket list. And like me, some of you might not know the history of the historic building or how the art gallery runs, so I thought this might interest you.

This sweet house originally set on lot 13 on Front Street and was owned by Mr. Richard Rustell Jr. and his wife Sarah Stanton and their two children in 1732. When Miss Sarah passed away Mr. Rustell remarried to Sarah Cogdell where they had two children Richard and Katherine.

The house was a typical Beaufort cottage, a story and a jump (1 & ½ stories) - two rooms on each floor. Sometime later a one-story addition was added to the back, 7 foot longer and a second story. The house was left to his first two children when he passed away but was contested by his second wife who gained custody of the house and lot 13.

In 1804 the house was sold to Jechonias Pigott for \$213, and when he passed away the house then belonged to his daughters. It was turned in 1885 to face Craven Street and then later it was moved 600 ft in 1974-1975 to its present location where plumbing was added.

In 1975 Laura Davis Piner established the gallery in the memory of her mother. In 1985 the name was changed from the Pigott House to Mattie King Davis Art Gallery, named for her mother who was an authority on local history. It is the oldest gallery in Carteret County.



Laura Davis Piner was a longtime chairman and helped grow the gallery while she taught art at East Carteret High School and continued her own art venture as well.

Currently the gallery runs strictly with volunteers and is a nonprofit, supported through site tours, memberships, the gift shop and some grants. These volunteers are mostly artists but also by art lovers! They work in ½ day shifts Monday - Saturday.

There is also a committee which is made up of 8 people who decide what artists can display their work through a jury process. Artists bring 3-5 pieces of their work to be judged and if they are approved they can become lifetime artists displaying their works of art!

Six times a year the gallery features an artist. These usually are tied to events which would include a reception and the artist shows their work in the first two rooms. After the event the featured artist work moves into one room.

Mattie King Davis Art Gallery also participates in other events in town, such as the Old Homes Tour. This year will be the 56th Annual Garden Tour June 24th & 25th, featuring homes and





artists. The Old Homes Tour Kickoff Party will be held June 4th, 5:30-7:30pm featuring Bunny Matthews at Mattie King Gallery.

Who puts this all together you might wonder. Patricia Suggs, Executive Director, from the Beaufort Historic Association and her team. Patricia comes to us by way of Greensboro where she worked at a Highpoint Furniture company and via a sailboat from Oriental.

When she arrived in Beaufort she took the position of Director of Operations at Camp Seafarer for many years. She then moved on and became the Town Manager of Oriental for a little while until she saw a posting for the Director position with BHA in the News & Observer newspaper. She has been with us 15 years now and keeps busy within many different areas of the BHA. You will see her around town fine tuning events, attending events and socializing with visitors and locals.

I hope you will take the time to stroll through this gallery, enjoying its history as well as the beautiful art among these walls. Also, please take a few minutes to thank the volunteer that is working when you stop by, as they help keep this open for all of us to enjoy!
